# Heart Rhythm Monitor Implanted after MI Does Not Prevent CV Events

In patients after myocardial infarction, implanting a loop recorder led to successful detection of arrhythmias and initiation of treatment, but did not significantly impact cardiovascular events although there was a trend to reduction in the highest risk subgroup, according to the results of a new study. Sarver Heart Center member Julia Indik, MD, PhD, a professor of medicine at the University of Arizona College of Medicine – Tucson, is quoted commenting on the results in this article.
